Did You Know???

1. GHS operates on a four block system. Students have four 85 minute classes a day. 5 min passing time. There is a 22 minute advocacy period for students to work on homework or seek assistance from teachers.
2. Some classes at GHS are one term (9 weeks), others are two terms (18 weeks) or four terms (all year).
3. Each class is worth $\frac{1}{2}$ credit. A student can earn up to 8 credits per year. Students need 28 credits to graduate from GHS. Here is the breakdown for moving from grade to grade:
 - a. Freshman 0-6 credits
 - b. Sophomores- 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ - 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ credits
 - c. Junior- 13-19 $\frac{1}{2}$ credits
 - d. Senior- 20 or more credits
4. Graduation Requirements include the following:
 - a. Eight terms of English
 - b. Five terms of Social Studies (Civics, US History, and Global Studies)
 - c. Six terms of Math (Algebra and Geometry)
 - d. Four terms of Science (2 terms of a lab science)
 - e. One term of Consumer Education (or Economics)
 - f. One term of Health
 - g. Two terms of PE
 - h. Four terms of Electives (Fine Arts, Foreign Language, or Vocational Education)
5. GHS has four lunch periods (A, B, C, and D). Your lunch period is based on your third block class. Your lunch period cannot be changed without changing your third block class.
6. You must have your GHS ID with you **every day**.
7. At GHS there are over 30 sports and clubs for you to get involved in.
8. We have spirit week during the week of Homecoming and Swirl along with the Homecoming parade, Homecoming Dance, and Swirl Dance.

This is only the beginning. There is so much more to know!!

What to do if.....

You are late to school: Students arriving late to school should check in at the main office. Student will get a pass to class from administration. Parent must notify the school.

You are late to class: Students late to class will be sent to administration for a pass. Repeated tardiness may result in a consequence.

You are absent from school: Parents must call the GHS attendance office line at 973-2279 on the day of a student's absence. Notes will not be accepted.

You have an appointment during the day: Parents must contact the school. A pass will then be sent from the main office/nurse to your classroom when it is time for you to leave class.

You have to leave during the school day: Report to the main office and you will be guided in the right direction (Nurse, Principal, etc). If you leave the building without properly checking out the absences will be unexcused and you will face a consequence.

You have a bullying/harassment problem: ***If you are being bullied/harassed tell the person to stop and report the incident to a staff member immediately.*** Appropriate actions may include mediation/police contact or filing a formal complaint. Harassment is considered to be words and/or actions directed toward an individual directly or online who intimidates, degrades, and/or fails to respect a person's dignity. Harassment includes references made to a person based on their age, sex, race, color, religion, disability, or sexual orientation. Verbal comments, sexual name-calling, gestures, jokes, and spreading rumors are also considered to be harassment. See Code of Conduct for more information.

You have something stolen at school: Notify the teacher of the classroom/locker it occurred in. You also should notify either the Deans, Mr. Kramer or Officer Luna. Do not share lockers!

Your locker does not open: Report to the main office and the secretary will notify a custodian.

General Student Information

Announcements

All school activities, lunch menu's, and meeting dates are given through daily announcements. Announcements are also posted on the Streaks website, social media, and TVs throughout the building.

Behavior towards Others

Any form of disrespect, abusive, aggressive, or violent behavior whether verbal, physical, sexual, or mental in nature toward other students, teacher, administrators, staff, guests, and visitors of the school will not be tolerated. Vulgar and/or obscene language or gestures, racial, ethnic or religious insults directed by students towards others may result in suspension and/or recommendation for expulsion.

Building Hours

The building will be open to students from 7:00am-3:10pm. Students in the building before 7:00am or after 3:10 pm must be under the supervision of a teacher/coach/activity sponsor.

Bullying and Harassment

If you are being bullied/harassed tell the person to stop and report the incident to a staff member immediately. Appropriate actions may include mediation/police contact or filing a formal complaint. Harassment is considered to be words and/or actions directed toward an individual directly or online who intimidates, degrades, and/or fails to respect a person's dignity. Harassment includes references made to a person based on their age, sex, race, color, religion, disability, or sexual orientation. Verbal comments, sexual name-calling, gestures, jokes, and spreading rumors are also considered to be harassment. See Code of Conduct for more information.

Cigarettes, Alcohol, and Drug use

Students must refrain from the use, possession, sale, or delivery of drugs, drug paraphernalia, look-alike substances, alcohol, or cigarettes. Failure to do so will result in disciplinary action.

Dances and Special Events

School dances and special events are limited at Galesburg High School. Students need to meet certain criteria in order to attend dances (refer to Code of Conduct). A GHS student may bring a high school student from another school by filling out the dance request form and turning it in by the due date.

Dress Code

The GHS faculty and staff believe that our dress code standards must encourage respect, character, and reasonable levels of modesty in our working environment and our school environment. Student clothing should not infringe on the rights of others. Any items that could disrupt other students from learning will be reported to the administration for further review. See the Code of Conduct.

Electronic Devices

Cell phones and other electronic devices are allowed between classes, during lunch, and during class with teacher discretion. This policy is currently being evaluated and may change at any time. Students may receive a consequence if electronic devices are being used inappropriately. See Code of Conduct for more information.

Final Exams

Finals are administered four times a year at GHS. Final Exams are worth 20% of the class grade. Students who are absent on final exam days must make arrangements with the teacher to make-up the exam.

Grade Point Average (GPA)

GPA will be computed at the end of each term. Report cards list the cumulative GPA. The point value for computing GPA is as follows: A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, F=0.

Hall Passes

Teachers will not give you a hall pass once class begins. Students are responsible for taking care of the things they need to do (going to locker, bathroom, water fountain, etc.) during the five minute passing period.

Honor Roll

Those students attaining a 3.5 or better GPA will be on the Honor Roll. Students with a 3.0 to 3.4 will receive honorable mention.

ID

ID's are required for all GHS students and must be on person's at all times. Students will need their ID's at school but they will also need their ID at lunch, in the library, at the bus stop, at athletic events, as well as other school functions. An ID replacement cost is \$5.

Internet/Chromebooks

The goal is to provide all students at GHS with the opportunity to access the wealth of information associated with the Internet. Chromebooks and internet access is property of CUSD #205. Students are expected to access appropriate material only. Inappropriate use will result in consequences for the student and loss of Chromebook or internet access at GHS. See Internet Use Policy in Code of Conduct for more information.

Lockers

Lockers and combinations are issued to students at the beginning of the year. Lockers should be kept locked. Students should not give their combinations to others because it increases the risk of lost or stolen items. Galesburg High School is not responsible for lost or stolen items. Any locker malfunction should be reported to the main office.

Lost and Found

A lost and found is maintained in the main office. Students with lost or found articles should immediately report to the main office to report an item that is missing or turn in an item found.

Lunch

There are four lunch periods at GHS. Your lunch is based upon your third block class. You will need your ID card to pay for your lunch. The breakfast and lunch menu are read in the announcements each day.

Make Up Work

Make-up work for all absences, such as personal illness and school-sponsored activities, may be made-up before or after the student returns. This is left at the teacher's discretion. A student who is absent shall be given the same number of days absent plus an additional day in which to make up the work. Work turned in late may not be accepted and the student may not be given credit for such make-up work.

Medical Information

Mrs. Moore is our Licensed Practical Nurse. She is here from 7:30-2:40 pm on most days. In the case of injury or emergency while at school, students are required to inform the nurse. Students are not allowed to visit the nurse without a pass, except in an emergency or when they have free, non-class time. If a student is not feeling well, he/she should report to class, obtain a pass from the teacher, and then report to the nurse. Students needing to leave school due to an illness must be excused by the nurse or an administrator before leaving the building. Parents will be notified when students are leaving the building due to an illness or emergency.

National Honor Society

Students must have an overall GPA of 3.5, faculty recommendations and involvement in activities that demonstrates their service, character, and leadership. This honor is awarded to junior and senior students who meet the qualifications.

Schedule Changes

All student initiated schedule changes must be completed by the third day of the term. After that point all schedules are final. Students will meet with counselors in February to choose courses for the following year. Schedule changes are generally only approved for the following reasons: computer error, failure of a course, or inappropriate class placement.

Department Flowcharts

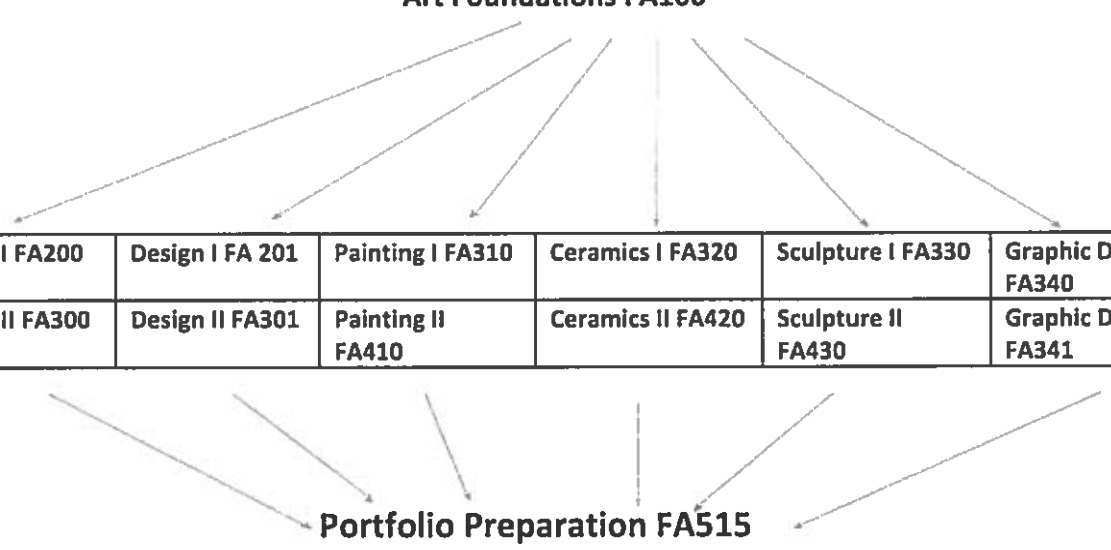
